## School Review Update

I am pleased to announce that our school performed very well in the first of our school review days with the reviewers commenting on how impressed they were with the great learning that was happening in our classrooms.


All classes had clear learning intentions and success criteria displayed and our students were aware of why they were doing what they were doing and what was expected of them. Our focus group of students gave the reviewers some insights into what they thought were positives and negatives of our school and these views will be taken into consideration when our new goals for the next 4 years are developed.

## Attitude to alcohol at school events survey

Thank you to everyone who participated in our Attitudes to Alcohol at School Events survey.

We received 327 responses to the survey, which is a fantastic response rate.

There is no doubt that this is a divisive issue. There were people who “strongly agreed” and “strongly disagreed” with every statement put forward on the survey. However, approximately two thirds of respondents considered it inappropriate for adults to consume alcohol at school events involving children. Sixty-nine percent of people felt that alcohol at school events was not a good image for children.



**Based on these findings the school council has determined not to have a bar at the 2019 school fair.** The next step will be to draft a school policy to guide future decision making about alcohol at school related events. The survey data, including the many thoughtful comments provided, will be carefully considered when formulating this policy. A more comprehensive report of the survey findings will be made available via compass soon.

## Prep 2020 enrolments

I am currently investigating building upgrades and making more teaching spaces to accommodate more students and would like an idea of how many students we will have next year to assist with this planning. ## CERES Excursion

On Thursday the 14<sup>th</sup> of March, all of the grade 5s and 6s went on an excursion to CERES Community Environment Park, a sustainability centre and urban farm that aims to make people more aware of our environment and what we can do to live more sustainably. There was a lot of excitement when we first arrived, as most of us didn't know what to expect! We worked together to complete three of the four activities that were available over the course of the day, each one of them had a different focus.



We also had to try to balance a lot of cans (which had the names of resources we use) on a log (that represented our Earth). This was a metaphor for the difficulty we face balancing our need for resources. Unfortunately, on the last can we were balancing on the log, the wind blew it over which disappointed most people!

We then went to an activity which involved repurposing an old t-shirt! We made the t-shirts into grocery bags that actually work! That was very entertaining for everyone but quite tricky to do.

The first activity 6B did was about our ecological footprint and use of resources. We found out that if we divide Earth's usable land up equally amongst all of the people, we would get about one hectare each. Would you be able to get all the resources you need to live your life using just one hectare? Most Australians have an ecological footprint of seven hectares - which means that we would need seven hectares for our lifestyle. This came as a shock to most of us.





For our last activity we had to place different waste objects onto a timeline to show how long we thought they would take to decompose or biodegrade. Following this, we did a rubbish relay. We worked in two teams to sort and dispose of rubbish into four types of bins - recycling, landfill, green waste and compost. If you put the rubbish in the wrong bin, your team scored a point. The objective was to have the least points at the end. Team two won with a score of two to fifteen, but team one were good sports and laughed it off!

Unfortunately 6B did not get to do all of the four activities but we enjoyed the ones that we did do. Overall, this was an incredible and fascinating excursion and I would recommend CERES to whoever is reading this. Thanks to Mr Bevis for organising the excursion and to all the parent helpers who came along. We could not have done it without you!

## Grade 2


### The Lab Incursion



## LOOKING AT ANXIETY

Anxiety has become such a big problem in society but sometimes we can miss what is really happening underneath the person's anxious behaviour. This is not an exhaustive list of anxiety's underlying causes and as you can imagine they are not things people "just get over". For children these types of under the surface feelings can be overwhelming in and of themselves let alone the physical expressions of being anxious.



So how do we know if someone is anxious or misbehaving? Well interestingly we all come up with ways of alleviating our anxieties/worries but for children sometimes these behaviours induce punishment or anger from adults in their world. How many of these do you see in your children? How many do you see in yourself?

### [Connect the dots to ACEs](#)

If your child is having problems with anxiety, there's plenty you can do to help. Above all, it's important to talk to your child about their anxiety/worries, what is happening in their body and why it happens.

Many children and young people don't know what they are feeling when they are anxious, and it can be very frightening and overwhelming.

Help them to recognise anxious feelings so they can tell when they are becoming anxious and can ask for help.





**8 WAYS A CHILD'S ANXIETY SHOWS UP AS SOMETHING ELSE**

**1. Anger**

The perception of danger, stress or opposition is enough to trigger the fight or flight response leaving your child angry and without a way to communicate why.



**4. Chandeliering**

Chandeliering is when a seemingly calm person suddenly flies off the handle for no reason. They have pushed hurt and anxiety so deep for so long that a seemingly innocent comment or event suddenly sends them straight through the chandelier.



**2. Difficulty Sleeping**

In children, having difficulty falling asleep or staying asleep is one of the hallmark characteristics of anxiety.



**5. Lack of Focus**

Children with anxiety are often so caught up in their own thoughts that they do not pay attention to what is going on around them.

**6. Avoidance**

Children who are trying to avoid a particular person, place or task often end up experiencing more of whatever it is they are avoiding.




**7. Negativity**

People with anxiety tend to experience negative thoughts at a much greater intensity than positive ones.

**3. Defiance**

Unable to communicate what is really going on, it is easy to interpret the child's defiance as a lack of discipline instead of an attempt to control a situation where they feel anxious and helpless.



**8. Overplanning**

Overplanning and defiance go hand in hand in their root cause. Where anxiety can cause some children to try to take back control through defiant behavior, it can cause others to overplan for situations where planning is minimal or unnecessary.

**Strategies to Manage Anxiety – GROUP SESSIONS**

In Term 2 I will be running 2 five week group sessions (1 hour per session). The focus will be to allow students to experience and practice the strategies. Group 1 will run Term 2 Weeks 1-5 and Group 2 will run for Weeks 6-10. Every week an exercise will be sent home for the child and parents to do together. It is important to practice these exercises on a regular basis so they become second-nature, so to speak, when anxiety drops by.

## Counselling Corner

With Ophelia

### The Fifth Love Language – Acts of Service

In the previous weeks, we have talked about the love language of affirming words, gifts, quality time, and physical touch. This week, we are going to look at how acts of service could fill children's emotional tanks.

Parenting is a 24/7 service-oriented vocation. Yet, our primary motivation shouldn't be pleasing our children, but to **do what is best for them**. What would most please your children at the moments is unlikely the best way to express your love. Although children could remain childishly self-centred and become selfish if parents give in to desires or demands for too much service, we shouldn't keep ourselves from using the language of service in appropriate ways. That is, **acts of service must be age appropriate**. We should do for our children what they cannot do for themselves. For example, making beds for a three-year-old child is an act of service, but doing so for an eight-year-old is not loving, but crippling him. In other words, when children are developmentally ready, we teach them how to serve themselves, and then others.

The following are some ideas for parents about expressing love through the acts of service:

- For younger children, set up your child's favourite toys when they are at school, so they can play with them immediately with you.
- Help your child practice for their hobbies (e.g. sports team).
- Connect your child with one of your (extended) family member or friends who can help them in an area of interest (e.g. violin playing, soccer, or science).
- Sit down and help your child when they are having problems with their homework.
- Choose one area in which you determine to always serve your child above and beyond expectations. (e.g. making sure their favourite soft toy is in their bed at bedtime, or ensuring there are always marshmallows in your child's hot chocolate).
